Feilden+Mawson shares the widespread concern about the effects of ill-considered construction on the global environment and is committed to continual improvement and protection of the environment, including prevention of pollution. We involve Clients and Interested Parties fully in all environmental matters and aim to agree and establish clear Objectives early in the Briefing Process. We are committed to fulfilling our Compliance Obligations, and a Continual Improvement of the Environmental Management System (EMS) operating under requirement of ISO 14001:2015, to enhance our Environmental Performance. Partners and Associates establish, implement and maintain the Environmental Policy. Our Environmental Management System Working Group advises Partners, providing a framework for setting F+M's Environmental Objectives, ensuring our policy is appropriate to the purpose and Context of our business, including the nature, scale and Environmental Impacts of our activities and services.

We encourage both the minimisation and prevention of environmental pollution through the protection of ecologically sensitive areas and the development of Brownfield sites as well as the use of safe and sustainable supplies of materials, products and services.

As Designers, Lead Consultants and Project Managers it is vital that we take the initiative and establish design solutions that will ensure a sustainable future for the built environment. To achieve this, we liaise closely with services consultants to explore energy-saving solutions and work towards reducing our projects' impact on the environment.

Controlling the use of raw materials and water and encouraging waste management policies, while being aware of embodied energy issues and Life Cycle energy consumption, are an important influence in achieving low-impact buildings. Effective low-energy design solutions must ensure a balance between capital and running costs.

We are members of the Green Register, have a BREEAM Accredited Professional and Passivhaus Designers, and Staff regularly attend seminars to maintain and improve our environmental integrity. F+M uses the RIBA Plan of Work as amended by the Green Overlay. Our EMS Working Group monitors environmental developments, advising Staff on current and future best practice, ensuring compliance with environmental legislation and other regulations relevant to our activities. These activities are regularly reviewed.

F+M believes that education, regulation and implementation must be used to ensure that we can make a positive contribution to achieving the UK Government's Target of 57% carbon reduction by 2030 on 1990 carbon emission levels..
